EMERGENCY & SAFETY PROCEDURES

MEDICAL EMERGENCIES

In the event of a medical crisis, dial 911 immediately. While most students are trained in first aid and CPR techniques, they are encouraged to seek out the Clinic Supervisor or a faculty member that is first aid/CPR trained. Students, faculty, and staff should also notify a TAMT staff member so that proper assistance can be provided. If an emergency occurs during an internship massage session, the supervising instructor will halt the session and administer first-aid or call 911 if needed.

CRIME/THREATS

Criminal activity or threats on campus should be reported to 911 first. Promptly inform TAMT's administrative staff once it is safe to do so.

EVACUATION/FIRE

Evacuation routes are posted near exits. Should a fire alarm sound or an evacuation be ordered, proceed immediately to the nearest exit in a calm and orderly manner.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

TAMT generally follows local Independent School District decisions regarding inclement weather closures. Announcements will be posted via email, website, or text alerts.

PROGRAMS

LICENSE MASSAGE THERAPIST 500 HOURS COURSE

Total Clock Hours: 500

Credential Awarded: Certificate of Massage

Structure: 450 hours of classroom/lab instruction + 50 hours of supervised internship

This program meets the foundational 500-hour requirement for obtaining a massage therapy license in Texas. Program length can vary from 2½ months (full-time) to 6 months or more (part-time), plus the separate 50-hour internship module (completed within three months).

COURSES

Below are summarized descriptions of the key courses in the Massage Therapy 500 curriculum.

MAT101 PRINCIPLES OF MASSAGE TECHNIQUES : SWEDISH

- Clock Hours: 125
- Delivery Method: In-Person Hybrid

This foundational course introduces students to Swedish massage, the most widely recognized Western massage modality. Emphasis is placed on learning and mastering the five primary strokes—effleurage, petrissage, friction, tapotement, and vibration—as well as proper body mechanics and draping procedures. Students explore the physiological and psychological benefits of massage, contraindications, client intake processes, and essential communication skills. By the end of the course, learners will be able to perform a full-body Swedish massage using safe, professional, and effective techniques.

ANP101 ANATOMY & PHYSIOLOGY1

- Clock Hours: 75
- Delivery Method: Online

This course provides a comprehensive overview of the human body's major organ systems and how they interrelate. Students develop a working understanding of anatomical terminology, tissue structure, and core physiological processes essential for safe and effective massage practice. Lectures and activities emphasize musculoskeletal, cardiovascular, nervous, respiratory, endocrine, and other relevant systems, highlighting how each system responds to massage and contributes to overall health. This course is designed to fulfill the Texas requirements for Anatomy and Physiology for Massage Therapists.

PAT 101 PATHOLOGY1

- Clock Hours: 25
- Delivery Method: Online

Focusing on common pathologies encountered in massage therapy practice, this course covers the nature and causes of various diseases and disorders. Students learn to identify indications and contraindications for massage in the presence of specific medical conditions. The course prepares students to adapt techniques to accommodate a client's health status and to collaborate responsibly with other healthcare professionals when necessary.

KIN 101 KINESIOLOGY1

- Clock Hours: 50
- Delivery Method: In-Person Hybrid

Kinesiology explores human movement from anatomical and biomechanical perspectives. Students analyze the structure and function of muscles and joints, learning how various body segments collaborate to create motion. Emphasis is placed on palpation skills, range-of-motion assessments, and understanding how muscle imbalances can contribute to pain or dysfunction.

HYD101 HYDROTHERAPY

- Clock Hours: 20
- Delivery Method: Online

This course covers the therapeutic application of water in various forms—heat, cold, steam, and more—to assist in relieving pain, reducing inflammation, and promoting relaxation or stimulation. Students gain practical skills in the safe administration of hydrotherapy treatments, including cryotherapy, thermotherapy, and contrast therapy, and learn to incorporate these techniques into broader massage sessions. This course is designed to fulfill the Texas requirements on Hydrotherapy for Massage Therapists.

HHH101 HUMAN HEALTH HYGIENE

- Clock Hours: 20
- Delivery Method: Online
- Certificate: American Red Cross First Aid & CPR

This course focuses on proper hygiene, sanitation, and health-related measures essential for massage professionals. Students learn infection control practices,

universal precautions, and strategies for maintaining a clean and safe therapeutic environment. Emphasis is also placed on the practitioner's personal health and wellness to prevent burnout and ensure longevity in the field. First Aid and Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation will be taught as well, by instructors who are certified by the American Red Cross. This course is designed to fulfill the Texas requirements for Health and Hygiene for Massage Therapists.

BLE 101 BUSINESS & ETHICS

- Clock Hours: 45
- Delivery Method: Online

BLE101 prepares students for the business and legal aspects of working in or operating a massage therapy practice. Topics include client record management, marketing strategies, financial planning, and compliance with local and state laws. Students also gain insights into professional and ethical behaviors, scope of practice, boundary-setting, and effective communication in client-therapist relationships. This course is designed to fulfill the Texas requirements for Business and Ethics for Massage Therapists.

MAT102 ADVANCE MASSAGE TECHNIQUES¹

- Clock Hours: 75
- Prerequisite: MAT101
- Delivery Method: In-Person Hybrid

Building upon the Swedish foundation, this course introduces specialized modalities and advanced hands-on skills. Techniques may include Deep Tissue, Sports Massage, Myofascial Release, Trigger Point Therapy, or Prenatal Massage, depending on the program's focus. Students refine palpation, assessment, and treatment planning skills, learning to tailor sessions to address more complex musculoskeletal issues.

INT101 CLINICAL INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

- Clock Hours: 50*
- Delivery Method: In-Person

- Prerequisites: 250 academic clock hours, including 100 hours of Swedish or other massage techniques courses, the completion of all makeup work and approval from both the Massage Instructor and the Program office.

*NOTE: Clock Hours for this course are measured in actual hands-on time with a patient. Additional time will be spent on prep, patient interviews, sanitation, writing session notes, meeting with the instructors for evaluation, and general down time.

The Clinical Internship Program serves as the capstone of our training curriculum, providing students with the opportunity to perform as Massage Therapists under the direct supervision and guidance of a Licensed Massage Therapy Instructor (LMI) in a controlled clinical setting. During the internship, students interview clients, perform massage therapy, review client evaluations with the course instructor, and complete various tasks essential for the successful operation of a massage therapy business. This immersive, hands-on experience enables learners to integrate theoretical knowledge, refine practical skills, and strengthen professionalism

ADMISSIONS

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

While TAMT values inclusiveness and diversity, the school reserves the right to deny applicants who do not meet professional, academic, or health standards needed to train and practice as massage therapists.

To Be Considered For School Admission, The Applicant Must Meet The Following Criteria:

1. **Health and Safety:** Applicants must be free of any contagious diseases. For questions or concerns about this requirement, please contact the Director at the time of application.
2. **Physical Ability:** Applicants must be physically able to perform tasks related to massage therapy, including but not limited to standing for extended periods, using their hands for massage techniques, and meeting the physical demands of training and practice.
3. **Age Requirement:** Must be 18 years or older.
4. **Educational Background:** Applicants must meet one of the following criteria:
 - a. Possess a high school diploma or its equivalent (e.g., GED).
 - b. Be beyond the age of compulsory school attendance (age 19 in Texas as per Education Code 25.085).
 - c. Be concurrently enrolled in a secondary school program if applicable.
5. **Academic Suitability:** Students may be required to demonstrate the ability to meet the academic demands of the program.
6. **Demonstrated Interest in Massage Therapy:** Students must have a genuine interest in Massage Therapy
7. **Selective Service Registration:** (for male U.S. citizens or resident aliens born after 1960): Applicants must have registered with the Selective Service between the ages of 18 and 25, as required by federal law.
8. **Catalog Acknowledgment:** Applicants must confirm that they have thoroughly read and understood this catalog prior to submitting their application.

Applicants Must Also Submit The Following:

1. A copy of valid driver's license
2. Social security number card or a copy of TDLR's "Occupational license application claiming to have no social security number"
3. Application fee, listed in the Fee Schedule.

CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECKS

Any applicant who is concerned that a previous criminal history may make him or her ineligible for licensure as a massage therapist may submit a Request for Criminal History Evaluation Letter to the Department along with a \$25 fee. The Department will evaluate the applicant's criminal history report and provide a written determination as to the applicant's current eligibility for licensure. INJURY, DISABILITY & ACCOMMODATIONS POLICY

Texas Academy Of Massage Therapy (TAMT Massage Academy) is committed to accommodating requests from otherwise qualified candidates with documented disabilities, provided the request is reasonable, properly supported, and does not disrupt classroom dynamics or hinder learning. Our accommodation process is designed to facilitate a smooth transition for all students. Additionally, TAMT is dedicated to ensuring that every student can participate safely and benefit fully from our courses. To achieve this, we may adjust course loads or require skills assessments when necessary, with such decisions made by the school director or student coordinator according to established guidelines and without additional fees. This policy also applies to injuries or changes in health that occur during enrollment and may affect a student's ability to successfully complete the program.

CLASS SIZE

Class sizes typically do not exceed an 18:1 student-instructor ratio for hands-on instruction. Additionally, classes require a minimum number of students, classes not reaching the minimum will be cancelled and a refund issued.

TUITION

Tuition rates exclude application fees, textbooks, or ancillary supplies unless otherwise noted.

Texas Massage Therapy 500-Hour Program

- Tuition: \$15 per clock hour for the 450-hour academic portion, totaling \$6,750.
- Internship: No tuition charge for the 50-hour internship segment.

BOOKS & FEE SCHEDULE

BOOKS & SUPPLIES

Students may obtain books independently or through TAMT's store (subject to availability). Scrubs are required for hands-on classes and internship; the first set of official TAMT internship scrubs is provided at no cost.

Students are responsible for purchasing required books and supplies, including those listed for individual courses. In addition, students will need to bring proper note taking supplies to school each day. A bag or backpack is recommended.

LIABILITY INSURANCE

TAMT assists students in obtaining student liability insurance from reputable providers e.g., American Massage Therapy Association(AMTA) or Associated Bodywork & Massage Professionals(AMBP).

MAKE-UP FEES

- \$10/day to attend an alternative class section.
- \$35/day for a structured make-up session, if offered.

OTHER FEES

- Application/Enrollment Fee: \$50
- Texas Student Permit Fee: \$25

OTHER POTENTIAL FEES

- Transcript Fee: \$25 each (first copy free)
- Transfer Fee: \$50 (for evaluating transfer coursework)
- Additional TAMT Scrubs: \$120 per set

TUITION PAYMENTS & PAYMENT PLANS

PAY-AS-YOU-GO PAYMENT PLANS

Payments can be made in full or a pay-as-you-go plan where students pay by subject. Please note that any student with a delinquent account may face administrative actions, and transcripts and certificates will be withheld until all outstanding balances are cleared.

PAYMENT IN FULL

Payment in full may be offered at a discount (if applicable). Acceptable payment methods include credit card, check, money order, or online payment through TAMT's portal.

FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

All outstanding balances must be settled before certificates, transcripts, or future registrations are processed.

CREDIT TRANSFER POLICIES

GENERAL CREDITS

Courses from other massage schools or training programs may be transferred if approved by TDLR and TAMT. At least 25% of any certificate or degree must be completed in-house at TAMT.

CANCELLATION, TERMINATION, AND REFUND POLICY

Texas Academy Of Massage Therapy (TAMT) adheres to the refund guidelines mandated by the State of Texas. A full refund of all amounts paid will be issued if a student cancels the enrollment agreement within 72 hours of signing (until midnight of the third day, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays). After this 72-hour period, if a student withdraws or is terminated, the refund will be calculated based on the percentage of classes completed, as follows:

- Less than 10% of classes completed: 90% of the remaining tuition will be refunded.
- 10% to less than 30% of classes completed: 80% of the remaining tuition will be refunded.
- 30% to less than 50% of classes completed: 75% of the remaining tuition will be refunded.

- 50% to less than 75% of classes completed: 50% of the remaining tuition will be refunded.
- 75% to less than 90% of classes completed: 10% of the remaining tuition will be refunded.
- More than 90% of classes completed: No refund will be provided.

If a student does not cancel within the 72-hour window and subsequently fails to begin the program, TAMT will retain no more than \$200. Refunds for any additional expenses (such as instructional supplies, books, student activities, laboratory fees, service charges, rentals, deposits, or other ancillary costs) will be processed in a reasonable manner.

In the event that the program is discontinued, refunds will be issued as follows:

- If the student is not provided with a transcript of all completed classes within 30 days of program discontinuance, a full refund of all tuition, fees, and other charges paid will be issued.
- If there is a significant change in the location of instruction (a change of 10 miles or more from the originally approved location) and the student is unable to complete the program at the new site, then either a full refund will be issued if no transcript is provided within 30 days of the change, or a refund of all unused tuition, fees, and other charges will be issued if a transcript of all successfully completed classes is provided within 30 days.

If a student is terminated for failing to meet admission requirements and does not complete the program, all tuition and fees will be refunded. Please note that leaves of absence, suspensions, school holidays, non-instructional days, and vacation periods are not counted toward the program's elapsed time when calculating refunds.

Refunds will be processed within 30 days following the earliest of:

- The effective date of termination,
- The receipt of the student's written notice of withdrawal, or
- Ten instructional days after the program's start date if the student fails to begin classes.

TAMT reserves the right to cancel any class or program due to insufficient enrollment, in which case all monies paid will be fully refunded.

STUDENT SERVICES

KITCHEN & BREAK-ROOM

Students have access to a communal break area with a refrigerator and microwave. Items left in the refrigerator are routinely discarded at week's end.

JOB PLACEMENT

While employment post-graduation is not guaranteed, TAMT maintains employer contacts, local job postings, and networking resources.

STUDENT PARKING

Students must park in the designated parking area. Vehicles should not occupy reserved spaces marked for other tenants.

TUTORING

Faculty-led tutoring sessions may be arranged at an hourly rate. Students should coordinate with instructors and the administrative office for scheduling and classroom availability.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Attendance is mandatory for all scheduled classes. Any absence must be made up to satisfy state hour requirements.

A student may be dismissed if:

- They miss more than 10 consecutive scheduled class days; or
- Their total absences exceed 15% of the entire program.

STUDENTS MUST ATTEND ALL THE HOURS IN THEIR PROGRAM TO GRADUATE
The termination date will be the last date of absence as stated above. A student whose enrollment is terminated for violation of the attendance policy may not re-enter the Massage Therapy Program before the start of the next grading period.

A student may not start a program after ten percent (10%) of the program has been taught except in those cases where appropriate credit for previous education has been given as outlined under **PREVIOUS EDUCATION AND TRAINING**.

Students that do not attend school for more than 30 days will be terminated, except for a documented and approved leave of absence.

BREAKS & ATTENDANCE

Classes typically include a 10-minute break per instructional hour and a 30-minute lunch break for full-day schedules.

Tardiness & Make-Up Work

- Over 15 minutes late = marked absent for that hour.
- Under 15 minutes late = requires making up 1 clock hour.
- All missed time must be made up through a scheduled process.

REPEATING A COURSE

Failed courses (<70%) must be repeated, incurring additional tuition charges.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

A formal request is required, subject to administrative approval. Leaves cannot exceed 30 program days (60 calendar days) in a 12-month period. Failing to return on schedule may result in termination.

SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS (SAP)

SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS GUIDELINES

1. Maintain a minimum 70% (C) in each course.
2. Complete all required hours and assignments.
3. Finish within 150% of the stated program length.
4. Avoid more than 10 consecutive absences without a valid LOA.
5. Successfully complete 70% of scheduled hours in each evaluation term.

Failure to meet SAP guidelines can lead to probation or dismissal.

GRADING SYSTEM

TAMT uses the following grading scale:

Letter	Numerical Range	Grade Points
A	90 - 100%	4.0
B	80 - 89%	3.0
C	70 - 79%	2.0
F	Below 70%	0.0

“Incomplete” or “Withdrawn” grades are not factored into GPA calculations.

GRADING POLICY

- Students have up to three attempts to pass a course final; a third-attempt passing score is recorded as 70%.
- Failing the third attempt results in course failure.
- Withdrawals result in incomplete course status, requiring a full retake.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To graduate, students must:

1. Earn a final passing grade ($\geq 70\%$) for all required courses.
2. Fulfill all required clock hours, including internship.
3. Clear any financial obligations to TAMT.

TRANSCRIPT RELEASE

Final transcripts and graduation certificates are released upon full settlement of tuition and fees.

TRANSFER POLICY & PREVIOUS EDUCATION

Official transcript evaluation is required for out-of-state or other institution training. TAMT honors credit for relevant coursework if recognized by TDLR.

STUDENT RECORDS

TAMT retains academic records indefinitely in secure storage. Students should notify the registrar of any address or name changes.

CODE OF CONDUCT

STATEMENT OF NON-DISCRIMINATION

TAMT does not discriminate on the basis of gender, race, religion, national origin, physical disability, age, or any other protected category.

STUDENT IN-CLASS PARTICIPATION

Massage therapy education requires both giving and receiving massage. Proper draping standards are strictly enforced for modesty and professionalism.

STUDENT DRESS CODE

Scrubs are mandatory for hands-on classes and internship. Footwear should be closed-toe and quiet. Non-compliance may result in dismissal from class until dress standards are met.

STUDENT DISMISSAL, SUSPENSION & TERMINATION

Grounds for dismissal or suspension include, but are not limited to:

1. Academic dishonesty or repeated absences.
2. Behavior threatening the health/safety of others.
3. Substance abuse on campus.
4. Unauthorized practice of massage therapy for compensation prior to licensure.
5. Sexual harassment or misconduct.
6. Theft or willful damage to school or student property.

SPECIAL NOTE FOR INTERNSHIP

Internship operates similar to professional employment. Tardiness, no-shows, or unprofessional conduct can result in immediate probation or removal from internship privileges.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT & SEXUAL MISCONDUCT

All forms of sexual harassment or misconduct are strictly prohibited. Any incident should be reported to TAMT's administration. Violators face disciplinary action, including possible termination.

DISCIPLINARY PROBATION

Students placed on probation must correct the cited behavior or academic deficiency within the stated timeframe. Additional violations may result in termination.

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

A formal written grievance may be filed with the School Director. Complaints are addressed in a timely, impartial manner.

STUDENT GRIEVANCE POLICY

If unresolved through TAMT's internal process, the student may seek recourse through relevant state regulatory bodies (e.g., TDLR).

GRADUATE LICENSING

MASSAGE THERAPIST LICENSING IN TEXAS

1. To become a massage therapist in Texas, you must meet the following minimum requirements.
2. Be at least 18 years of age.
3. Complete at least 500 hours of study, such as our 500-hour program, including 50 hours of internship.
4. Submit your application to the State of Texas (\$100)
5. Pass either
 - a. Massage and Bodywork Licensing Examination (MBLEX) (\$265 as of 6/17/2022)
 - i. Must also complete the Jurisprudence Exam (approximately \$35)
 - b. TDLR Texas Massage Therapist Examination (\$60 as of 6/1/2023)
6. Successfully pass a criminal history background check (including fingerprints) (approximately \$35)

LICENSING IN OTHER STATES

Other states have varied requirements. Prospective practitioners should contact the respective state boards for details on license transfer or reciprocity.

INELIGIBILITY FOR LICENSE

Certain convictions or legal issues may render an individual ineligible. TDLR offers a criminal history evaluation for \$25 if you have concerns about past convictions affecting licensure.
